which meet HKIA's strict safety targets for all areas of airport operations, including ramp safety, and aim to inspire a robust safety culture and inspection/audit programme.

Based on pre-Covid operations, WFS Fueling provides into-plane fueling services for more than 40 airlines operating some 65,000 flights per year at HKIA, while WFS Holding's baggage handling teams at handle approximately 2.7 million passenger bags per month, including check-in, transfer, Air-to-Sea, Sea-to-Air and OOG (Out of the Gauge) baggage.
